Paul Matthews, Christie Nielsen and Chambrel Riley were present to represent the Port.

The Prayer said and the Pledge was recited.

There being no Proclamations or Bids and Advertisements, Commissioner Barthelemy moved to Agenda Item 3, "Status Report by the Executive Port Director". Without objection, so ordered. Paul Matthews reported the following:

- Sandy Sanders is in Illinois meeting with the Governor and Lt. Governor about prospective customers about the possibility of moving their facilities to Plaquemines;
- The Port staff is excited that Mr. Sanders is moving forward with his employment contract;
- The Port awarded more than \$600,000 in Port Security grant funds which is more than any other Port in Louisiana;
- Since signing the CEA with the Port of Greater Baton Rouge we are now in the process of
 moving particular emergency assets to their maritime emergency center;
- Venture Global will be holding an Environmental scoping meeting on August 12th from 4:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Auditorium in Belle Chasse;
- The LNG construction permit is being submitted this week;
- They are working on a packet of enabling statutes and constitutional articles to give to the Council Members;
- Last Tuesday Paul Matthews provided a briefing to the WTC Transportation Committee;
 and
- The Mississippi River gauge is lower so the Port is able to move forward on projects

Commissioner Arbourgh stated he is appreciative for Sandy Sanders signing his employment contract but he still has concerns about what happened at the last meeting and the message it sends to the community.

A recap of the meeting between Sandy Sanders, Paul Matthews, Commissioner Black and the State Transportation Secretary was given regarding the Port seeking out options in which they could be involved in the construction of the new Belle Chasse Bridge. No decisions were made at said meeting.

A discussion was then held regarding the proposed toll on the new Belle Chasse bridge wherein members of the public made comments.

Under Item 3b, "Financial Report/Budget to Actual", the Port had nothing to report.

Commissioner Barthelemy moved to Item 5, "Introduction of Ordinances and Resolutions". The following was introduced:

 A Resolution authorizing Maynard J. "Sandy" Sanders, Executive Director of the Plaquemines Port, Harbor & Terminal District (the Port) to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with U.S. Army Engineer, New Orleans District concerning the provision of funds pursuant to the section 2106 of the Water Resources Reform and Development Act of 2014; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto.
